

InterNational Jamboree 2016

The 29th Icelandic InterNational Jamboree will be held from 17 – 24 July 2016. The InterNational Scout Jamboree is one of the largest scouting events held in Iceland, and this year's theme will be "The Great Expedition".

The Jamboree is open to all scouts between the ages of 10-22. In addition, everyone is welcome at our family camp.

The opening ceremony will be held on Sunday, 17 July. Participants are expected to have settled in prior to the start of the ceremony. Visiting day will be Saturday, 23 July, during which families and friends of participating scouts will be invited to attend Carnival Day. Saturday evening marks the high point of the Jamboree – the Festival Programme and Campfire. Truly an event not to be missed!
